<p><i>Communication and Language</i> Children will: talk about everyday events and be encouraged to become more confident with their speaking and listening skills. experiment with story-making and will sequence and retell familiar stories.</p>	<p><i>Physical Development</i> Children will: develop their co-ordination of different parts of the body, develop a tripod pencil grip and draw and make marks with increased control.</p>
<p><i>Personal, social and emotional development</i> Children will: to be increasingly independent in making choices in nursery and aware that we need to share, take turns and help each other. have experiences of working in different groups and to express their needs and feelings in appropriate ways.</p>	<p><i>Understanding the World</i> Children will: make observations and comparisons the summer season and the seaside. explore mini beasts and learn about the life cycle of a butterfly, duckling and a chick. talk about road safety.</p>
