Thought for The Week

Last week's Gospel tackled the theme of **waiting**; it was apt with Advent just around the corner. The wise bridesmaids in the parable knew they may have to **wait** and so they brought enough oil for their lamps to sustain them through the night. Last Friday in school, 3C presented an assembly for their parents on the theme of remembrance. Listening to the children, I was reminded that the red poppy shares its colour with that of the Holy Spirit — the red tongues of fire! I read in a survey at the beginning of the month that, when asked, many people who wear a poppy for remembrance could still bring someone to mind against whom they harbour a grudge. They are **waiting**, I guess, before finding it in their heart to forgive and forget—in a sense, remembering the dead but forgetting the living. It is the Holy Spirit who shows us a better way of living. One that is based upon forgiveness and seizing the opportunity to make up with people with whom we are estranged in the here and now. It is not a lesson to be lost.
