Support from Home

The teachers have been busy identifying for us those parents who support their child at home. It has been a significant undertaking but a very worthwhile one. The great news is that most parents are supporting their child with their reading — around 54 out of 60 in every year group do so. This is fantastic! Thank you to these parents who are doing all they can to support their child with this vital life skill. I realise that it isn't always easy with the busy lives we lead and it is very much appreciated. The rate of support from home with homework in writing (spellings and Time to Shine) and maths (known facts and homework) stands at 75%. This means three out of four children are being regularly supported. Again, we thank you for all the support being given. Support from home is worth at least 10 marks in each of the exams that the children take. Given that there is just one mark between pass and fail, the 10 marks are worth their weight in gold!

If you are a parent who does not support your child, we have asked ourselves the question in school why? Is it because you are not clear what you should be doing? Is it that you don't understand the methods being taught in school? Is it that you don't realise that they have homework to do? If so, that is our fault. We are looking at ways of how we can better support all our parents through **Fronter**, when helping their children with homework. My own son's school has an App called **Show My Homework** and we are exploring if this is something parents would find useful to have on their phone.
