We have had a great day in school, with children wearing their Christmas jumpers and enjoying Christmas lunch. Well done to our cook Samantha and her team - I believe they fed over 350 of our children. Sitting with the children on Top Table, Mrs Roberts and I both enjoyed the festive meal.

Autumn Assessments

This week, I have been able to look at the children's results from the assessments that they have taken this month. Overall, I am pleased with what I am seeing. It is clear that children, staff and parents have worked very hard indeed. My thanks to all of you. I am confident that when children take their SATs this summer in Y6 and Y2, they will do well. Progress in other years and sets has been good this term too. It is apparent that our younger children have been hardest hit by the interruptions to their schooling, particularly in reading. In school, we will be doing all we can to help children in our infant school (aged 4 to 7) to make accelerated progress in the months to come and I know we will be able to count on your support at home. In terms of our junior children, the progress of some of our more able mathematicians is not where we would want it to be. When we returned after the first round of school closures in September 2020, I said I thought it would take two full years to regain our stride. We remain on track for such a recovery, but it is going to have to be worked for...

4K

The parents of many of our Y4 children, were expecting a suitably experienced agency teacher to teach their children from

Friday 26th November, as Mrs Kaur is convalescing at home following surgery. However, due to the continued impact of the pandemic, there is a national shortage of agency teachers to cover short-term absence: schools are having to call upon such agencies more than hitherto because more permanent staff are absent — either ill or waiting for the result of a PCR, having shown symptoms. In turn, there are some supply teachers having to self-isolate or take sickness absence for the same reasons. Therefore, I have asked Mrs Mackie to teach 4K until Mrs Kaur's return. Mrs Mackie is an experienced Y4 teacher at our school—children respond well to her. I will ask her to make herself available to the parents of children in 4K in a Teams video call on our return after the Christmas break, so she can answer any questions you may have. I expect Mrs Kaur to return in the Spring, but will keep you updated.

Mrs Grady (member of St Bede's staff from September 2018 to July 2021) has returned to St Bede's to teach the RE lessons across the school that would have been taught by Mrs Mackie. We are delighted to see her back - such a great teacher.
