Dear Everyone

I hope you have had a good week.

The past few days have certainly been eventful both at home and on the world stage.

We have seen the government update its approach to the management of COVID within communities. Whilst those suffering with COVID are no longer required by law to isolate, as a school we are continuing to ask children and staff who test positive to isolate for at least five days; if on the fifth day they test negative, they can return on the following day. If they do not, they must continue to isolate until they test negative on two consecutive days or a further five days have elapsed (making 10 in total). I do not expect to continue in this way indefinitely.

There is now no requirement for close contacts to isolate or test daily.

Everything else that we have in place to contain the spread of COVID will continue for the remainder of this term, but then stop. Next term, the school will return to its normal cleaning schedules. There will be other changes then too, but I will outline these in a revised risk assessment.

Further afield, we have in recent days seen violent conflict erupt in Eastern Europe. We will 'touch' upon this with our older children, but at their age I would not want them to worry. This is a conflict that will ultimately be resolved. We will invite children to pray for peace, but we do not want them to be troubled.

As we approach Lent, Mrs Mackie tells us how Pope Francis has said we should approach this season of grief. It is thought provoking. I will be putting the Holy Father's list by my bedside in order to keep it close as we make our way to the celebration that is Easter.

Weekly Reflection, with Mrs Mackie

It seems that we have only just been celebrating Christmas and yet we will begin the season of Lent next Wednesday. Throughout the school, we have been preparing our promises for our Lenten trees.

Lent is the period of time when we remember Jesus' time in the desert, before he began his three years of ministry. During this time of sacrifice, he was tempted three times but never succumbed.

We tend to associate Lent with fasting: giving up something we like, so that in a very small way we too sacrifice. In school, however, we have explored a different way of thinking about fasting.

Pope Francis said that fasting should be about looking at ourselves and reflecting on how we can change:

Fast from hurting words and say kind words
Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.
Fast from anger and be filled with patience
Fast from worries and have trust in God.
Fast from pressures and be prayerful
Fast from bitterness; fill your hearts with joy.
Fast from selfishness and be compassionate.

The children have reflected on this message and have created personal promises that they hope will not only lead them to change in Lent but will be a beginning that they will adopt for the rest of their life. Maybe you could create your own promises based on Pope Francis' message?

While we are thinking about Lent our minds are also drawn towards what is happening in the Ukraine. At this time we particularly think of anyone in our school community who have family and friends in the country. Pope Francis has also asked us to make Ash Wednesday a day of prayer for peace.

Famous Mathematicians

Did you know...

Elbert Frank Cox was born in Evansville, Indiana, in December 1895. He earned the baccalaureate degree from the University of Indiana in 1917 with a major in mathematics. After serving in the US Army in France during World War I, he returned to pursue a career in teaching. Before enrolling in the graduate mathematics program at Cornell University in September 1922, he taught mathematics in the public schools in Henderson, Kentucky and later at Shaw University in Raleigh, North Carolina. In 1925, he was awarded the 'Doctor of Philosophy' degree in mathematics from Cornell and thus, he is the first black person to receive the Ph.D. in Mathematics in the world.
