








Open evening

These will be held on Monday 10th July and Monday 17th July from 4pm -5pm. You will have received an e-form to state which session you will be attending.


We will meet you at the back gate (Bishops Avenue) at 4pm. This is a great opportunity for you to come in and meet the team and see the setting.





Induction

All children to start on Wednesday 6th September 2023. The children will come in via the back gate (Bishops Avenue) at 9:00am, this will be for the children who are **full time** or have a **morning** session only. Morning children are to be collected at 12 o'clock from the same gate. **Afternoon** session children will also to come to the back gate at 12:30pm to be collected. Nursery finishing time is 3:30pm all children to be collected from the back gate.

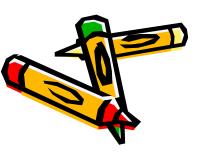

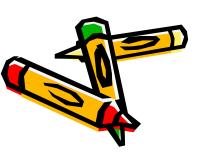
Uniform

Children in nursery are still expected to follow the uniform policy. You can find the details for our uniform on the school website. They will need to wear a royal blue tracksuit with a white school polo shirt underneath. During the warmer weather your child may wear shorts. We ask for your child to wear trainers that have a velcro fastening. We do not allow unusual hairstyles (e.g. tram lines/steps/stripes/motifs/ Mohawks/Mohicans/coloured hair extensions etc). Beads are not permitted in any part of the hair. All hair (in any style) that is longer than the length of the shirt collar must be completely tied back at all times using hairbands, hair ties or small ribbons (no diamantes or other decoration) and clips must be plain white, royal or navy blue. Hair bows must be small — we do not allow oversized bows embellished with decorations/diamantes (e.g. Jo Jo Siwa style)



Uniform

- We are asking for you to provide your child with a pair of wellington boots and a rain mac/all in one.
- Please ensure that every item of uniform is clearly labelled with your child's name.
- Please purchase a St Bede's book bag and a sports cap water bottle for your child. If your child is full time they will need a packed lunch bag please ensure this bag has your child's name on it too.
- Please provide your child with some spare clothing in case of any accidents (toileting or getting wet at the water table).

- · Equality of opportunity to support children of all backgrounds.






Early Years Curriculum

There are seven areas of learning and development in the early years, they are:


- Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

- Physical Development (PD)
- Literacy (L)
- Mathematics (M)
- Understanding of the World (UOW)
- Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)





Early Learning Goals

We will use these seven areas of learning when planning for the children. As well using topics based on the children's interests. For us the child's voice is important. The early learning goals are divided up into 17 strands. They will consist of the prime areas of learning which will cover PSED, C&L and PD. When focusing on these areas of learning we will be providing your child the skills needed to progress their development.



Personal, Social and Emotional




Together we will learn how to talk about how we feel, how to share, how to take turns, how to care for one another and how to be respectful of one another.



Communication and Language



Together we will learn how to listen to one another, share our ideas and understanding. We will do this through stories, role play and drama activities.






Physical Development



Throughout the year the children will build on their fine and gross motor skills through a wide range of resources and activities.





Literacy





Your child will have the opportunity to explore books throughout the day. Each week they will bring home a book to share with you. There are many opportunities for your child to build on their mark making skills.



Maths



Maths in the early years is all about hands on experiences and singing. Children learn by doing and exploring. We will provide many opportunities for your child to explore. Maths resources can be found all around our learning environment.



Phonics



Nursery is where your child's phonic knowledge will begin. We will learn to listen for rhyming words in stories and poems. We will learn how many syllables there are in our names and words. We will learn to listen for initial sounds in the words. We then begin to match the letter to the sound.

Understanding of the world





Expressive Arts and Design




Expressive arts is not just about painting, it is learning new songs, how to move to different types of music, using musical instruments, engaging in the role play area.















Rewards

In nursery we use the traffic light system. If your child ends the day on Freddy frog they will receive a sticker. Throughout the year children will receive certificates for their different achievements. We believe in praising the children, this enables them have that feeling of success. In the summer term we will introduce the children to Lantern of the week. Each week 2 children are rewarded for their achievements with a certificate.





Lunches

If your child is a full time child, you will need to provide them with a packed lunch. Please don't feel their lunch bag with lots of food. You will find that many children will find this quite daunting as they do not know what to eat first. Please ensure that the lunches are healthy — NO CHOCOLATE, FIZZY DRINKS OR SWEETS. WE ARE A NUT FREE SCHOOL. During the day we have snack time where your child will have access to fruit and milk.









Toileting

Coming into Nursery your child should be toilet trained. Toileting accidents can happen through out the day. This is why we have asked for spare clothes for them to change in to. The children have access to the toilets all day and will be encouraged/reminded to go.

If for any reason your child is **not yet toilet trained** can you please let us know. There is still the 6 weeks to encourage your child to start their toilet training.






Medical

If your child has any medical needs you will need to.....

- Inform us about their medical needs.
- Make sure your child has any required medication in school. This
 needs to be brought in on their first day of school.
- Speak to schools SENCO lead so that we can put a plan into place for your child.

We have a school nurse who we are in contact with so if you have any concerns please let us know.
