Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will know:

- right from wrong;
- to be respectful by listening to what others have to
- that classroom rules are to be followed

Children will be able to:

- give focused attention to what they teacher says;
- respond appropriately even when engaged in
- show an ability to follow instructions involving several ideas or actions;
- explain the reasons for rules;
- behave according to the rules most of the time;
- set work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want;
- control their immediate impulses when appropriate;
- show sensitivity to their own and to others' needs;

Communication and Language

Children will know:

- that they can show their understanding by answering questions linked to topics and stories that they are engaged with;
- vocabulary in the right context

Children will be able to:

- make comments about what they have heard;
- ask questions to clarify their understanding;
- offer explanations for why things might happen;
- use recently introduced vocabulary when appropriate;
- express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences;
- use past, present and future tenses correctly;
- use conjunctions with modelling and support from their teacher;
- participate in classroom and small group discussions

Physical Development

Children will know:

- a range of ways to combine movements with ease and fluency;
- a range of tools they can manipulate;
- factors which benefit us with our wellbeing and our overall health;
- a range of apparatus and equipment.

Children will be able to:

- demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing;
- negotiate space and obstacles safely, with consideration for themselves and others;
- hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing (tripod grip in almost all cases);
- develop control when using equipment such as bats and balls;
- prepare vegetables with the correct equipment in a safe manner;

Literacy

Children will know:

- at least 10 digraphs;
- the formation of lower case and capital letters
- to read simple sentences and phrases
- the spelling of words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sounds with letter/s

Children will be able to:

- use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, nonfiction, rhymes and poems and during role play;
- say a sound for each letter in the alphabet;
- write a simple sentence using a capital letter and full stop;
- write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by themselves and others;



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Maths

Children will know:

- numbers to 10, including the composition of each number;
- bonds of 5;
- some bonds of 10;
- will understand odd and even
- how to recall number bonds to 10
- how to compare weight, length and capacity

Children will be able to:

- explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10;
- explore how shapes can be made from different shapes;
- build an understanding of how teen numbers are made;
- develop an understanding of addition and subtraction within 20;

Understanding the World

Children will know:

- the seasons;
- some elements of the natural world around them;
- similarities and differences of life between this country and others

Children will be able to:

- understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling;
- explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants;
- understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them;
- draw information from a map

Religious Education

Children will know:

- who Jesus was and the names of some of his friends;
- the names of some different religions.

Children will be able to:

- make connections about what makes a good friend and how to be a good friend;
- talk about Jesus and his friends;
- explore different religions

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will know:

- different emotions and movements that represent these;
- names of commonly used materials and tools.

Children will be able to:

- make use of props and materials when role playing characters in narratives and stories;
- safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function;
- invent, adapt and recount narratives and stories with peers and their teacher;
- perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others;
- try to move in time with music, when appropriate;
- sing in tune and harmony, both as an individual and in a group.
